Credit Score check up-

Your credit score plays a key role in your financial well-being—it can impact your ability to rent housing, get a loan, or even qualify for utilities. The good news? You can improve your credit over time with a few smart habits.

Tip: Start by paying all your bills on time—every time. Payment history is the single biggest factor in your credit score. Even small bills like phone or utility payments can make a difference.

Other Helpful Steps:

- Keep credit card balances low (aim to use less than 30% of your credit limit).
- Check your credit report regularly for errors at [AnnualCreditReport.com](https://www.annualcreditreport.com).
- Avoid opening too many new accounts at once, which can temporarily lower your score.

Beattie House Apartments



The Beattie House holds a rich history deeply rooted in the Littleton community. Originally constructed as the Littleton Hospital, the building served generations of local residents, welcoming newborns, treating illnesses, and offering a place of healing for decades. Over the years, the hospital eventually closed, and the building fell into disrepair. What was once a cornerstone of community health became a deteriorating structure, vacant and in need of purpose.

Recognizing both the historical significance and the potential of the building, AHEAD took on the challenge of transforming the former hospital into something the community desperately needed: affordable housing for seniors.

After extensive planning and collaboration, AHEAD completed a full renovation of the building, preserving its historic character while adapting it for modern residential use. On August 29, 2007, Beattie House officially reopened with 23 thoughtfully designed apartments, symbolizing both a respectful nod to the past and a hopeful step toward the future.

The grand opening brought together past and present. Many attendees shared personal memories—some had once worked within its walls, while others had been born there. The event also featured historical photos from the hospital's earlier days, offering a visual journey through the building's transformation.

Named in honor of its historical roots and community importance, Beattie House now stands as a powerful example of how a once-neglected landmark can be reborn through vision, determination, and community partnership. Today, it is not just a place to live—it's a home rich with history and renewed with purpose. This spring, AHEAD continued to invest in this important historic property by repainting the entire exterior of the building. 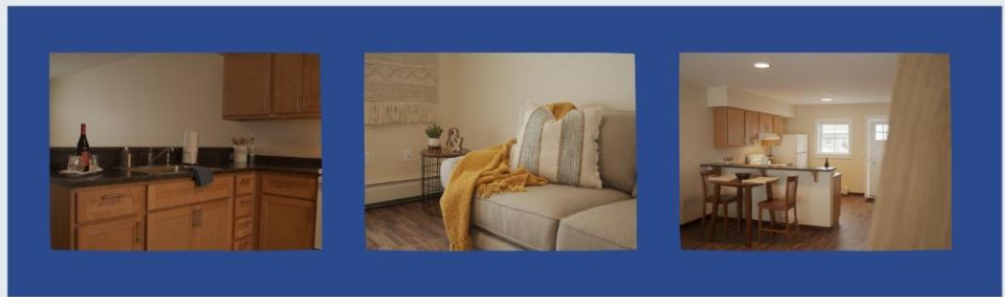
